On December 4, 2010 - just a little over a year ago - my heart was changed forever. That was the day that I met Endrias Enkesh, the biological father of Lydia. Lydia had officially become our daughter three days prior when we appeared in court in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. Once the adoption was finalized we were given the official clearance to travel 6 hours south to the Wolaita region to visit the Kingdom Vision International Orphanage where Lydia was first taken, and then to meet her father and siblings.

We arrived at the orphanage on Friday and then were informed that we would have to wait until the next morning for the hour and a half drive out to Damot Gale, the area where Lydia was born and where her father and three siblings lived.

The next morning was a very emotionally draining time as we met Lydia's family and shared our hearts with them. I knew at that moment they would be part of our life story forever.

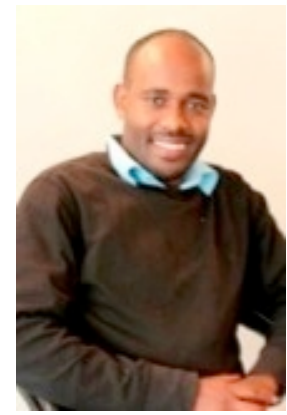
On the return trip to Addis I wrestled with God about where He was in this situation. I could see how God was meeting their spiritual needs, but I could not see how He was meeting their physical needs.

The response I heard from God was, "That is what the Church is for, what are you going to do about it?"

Over the last year I have dreamt about how I might connect my faith community at LFC with my new extended family in Ethiopia. I have shared this heart with our Elders and we have prayed about the opportunity to explore and set up a new long term relationship with a number of strategic partnerships in Ethiopia.
