Gospel Storytelling: Part 3 Sanctification, a Matter of Community over Programming

Two months ago I began writing this article around the idea of helping us develop into a community of Gospel Storytellers. In these writings I have been dissecting our definition of the Gospel: "Imperfect people, clinging to the perfect Christ, being made perfect through the Holy Spirit and helping other imperfect people."

In April, I wrote about "Embracing the Imperfect Without Embracing the Imperfection."

Last month I addressed the issue of "Clinging to the Perfect Christ and Embracing Your Perfection in Christ." I hope you read this and spent some time dwelling on the amazing gifts that become ours the moment we accept Christ as our Lord and Saviour.

This month I want to briefly encourage us with the third piece of our definition of the Gospel: "being made perfect by the Holy Spirit". This is the lifelong call of the believer to be sanctified. Sanctified means 'to set apart as or declare holy or to consecrate'. This is the process of making us into how God sees us. Upon our acceptance of Christ's sacrifice on the cross, God immediately sees the righteousness of Christ when he looks on us, rather than seeing our filth and shame. This is called justification. Now we need to become what God sees.

The Holy Spirit is given to the Christian as one of the gifts of our salvation. One of the Holy Spirit's roles in our lives is to guide us and protect us as we walk the road of sanctification. This road is a long and arduous one that will without fail last as long as our life here on earth. While the results of justification are instantaneous and dependent on the work of Christ alone, the fruit of sanctification comes slowly, much more slowly, and requires much effort on our part. Author and pastor Eugene Peterson, in a book I have read often, has this to say about the process:

"There is a great market for religious experience in our world; there is little enthusiasm for the patient acquisition of virtue, little inclination to sign up for a long apprenticeship in what earlier generations of Christians called holiness."

In my mind, I cannot separate the process of sanctification from the call to be a diligent disciple of Jesus Christ. While I believe that discipleship began before I accepted Christ, the bulk of my discipleship has been focused on the sanctification and redemption of my life through the work of the Holy Spirit.

I admit that this has not always been easy, and for sure I have had seasons where sanctification has seemed weak, if not missing altogether, but I know without a doubt it has always been worth the level of commitment that it requires.

I often have people ask me for tools to aid them in the sanctification/discipleship process in their lives. What they want most of the time is a book, a program, a video series or some other tool. While I used to give out these tools and still do at times, I believe that what is most needed is more and/or better relationships. It always means deepening our relationship with Christ. We simply cannot be sanctified without deepening in that relationship. Often, though, what is most needed is more or deeper relationships with other stumbling disciples of Christ. We have not been called to walk this journey alone. We have access to our Heavenly Father through our relationship with Jesus, and we have the Holy Spirit working in us at all times, but another great gift we have is the community of faith that God has designed for our good and His glory.

If you truly desire to grow in sanctification, I encourage you to read your Bible regularly to hear from God, pray to Him so He hears from you, and connect in relationship to other Christians. Walking in community is a good way to be encouraged on your journey as you encourage others

as well. We are all stronger when we walk together and as we walk in accountability to God and others.

"Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, with all wisdom teaching and admonishing one another with psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in your hearts to God." Colossians
